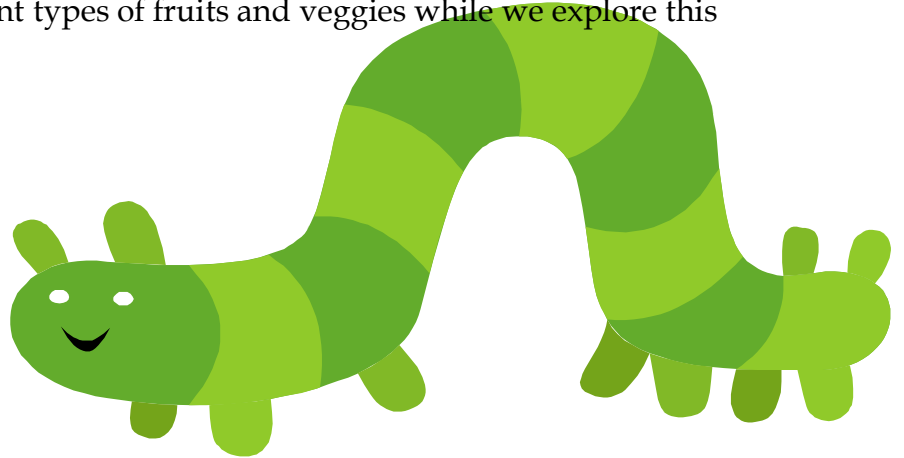


Dear Parents,

Room 5 - Welcome April!!

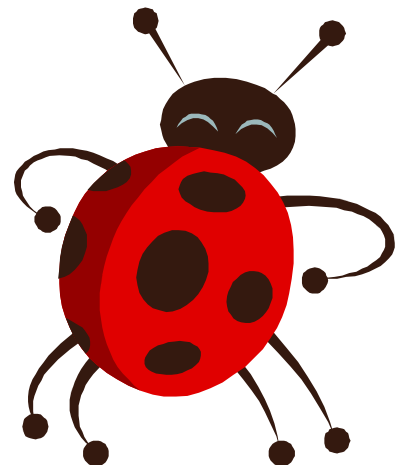

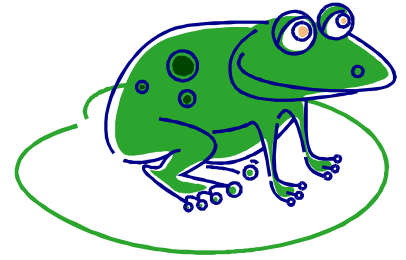
As the weather gets warmer we will be spending as much time outside as we can. Please be sure to label all children's jackets.
